We start flu vaccination one month earlier this year !!

A new flu vaccine is made each year because flu viruses are changing almost every year. Getting a flu shot EVERY year is highly recommended.

SNU Health Service Center starts flu shot earlier this year than before taking the surge of Hong Kong Flu in May and June in 2015 into consideration.

How effective is the flu vaccine?

Flu vaccine is 70-90% effective in keeping healthy adults from getting sick from flu.

Flu vaccination lowered the risk of hospitalizations by 50-60% in people 50 years of age and older, and was 80% effective in preventing death of old people.

Who SHOULD get vaccinated against flu?

- Children over 6 months to 5 years of age
- Adults over 50 years
- People taking care of kids under 6 months
- People living with adults over 50 years
- Women who are or will be pregnant
- Person who have immunosuppression and their family members
- Patients with diabetes, chronic pulmonary diseases (including asthma), heart diseases (except isolated hypertension), liver, kidney, neurologic, hematologic, or metabolic disorders
- Children and adolescents who are receiving long-term aspirin therapy
- Health care providers

Adults aged 19 to 49 years?

Even healthy people can get the flu, and it can be serious. Everyone 6 months and older should get a flu vaccine. This means you! This season, protect yourself—and those around you—by getting a flu vaccine.

Person with egg-allergy can get the flu shot this year at SNU HSC!

We will use a newly developed (cell-cultured) vaccine instead of egg-based vaccine this year. Person with egg-allergy can get the flu shot with no risk of allergic reaction!
